



REVIEW OF APPROVED NOVEMBER MINUTES

TREASURER'S REPORT: The current balance stands at approximately \$99,800, which is approximately \$48,000 less than the same time last year (as a result of approximately \$65k spent renovating the tennis court in 2017). Year-to-date (through 12-31-17) expenses were approximately \$122,000, leaving accounts in good standing.

NEW BUSINESS

- **Board Election/Updated Bylaws/Directory --** Materials mailed January 2 to all residents (different mailing for Unit 1 -- no ballots or mandatory dues). To date we've received 36 Unit 2 responses (30 ballots) and 3 Unit 1 payments.
- **Luminaries:** Everyone agreed that we had an extremely nice holiday display this year compliments to our neighbors! All luminary orders have been paid and deposited, and all expenses paid, leaving us with approximately \$310 in the luminary account.
- **Pioneer Community Energy** Pioneer recently mailed a letter and postcard to residents announcing that they will be the official electricity provider for homes and businesses throughout Placer County, as of February 2018, unless customers opt to remain with PG&E. Chris offered to draft an explanatory/opinion piece to send to the neighborhood about this new default electric generation service provider.

Trash Talk

Monday nights in FLE are "trash nights"—the time most of us haul our toters — the official Recology name for our trash containers—to the curb (leaving 5 feet of space around each toter) for early-morning pickups on Tuesdays. Then again, "trash" is a relative term as our service provider, Recology, is what is known in the business as a single stream recycler. At a state-of-the-art facility at the corner of Athens Avenue and Fiddyment Road in Lincoln, our refuse goes through a multi-step process that captures recyclable materials to be sure that, well, nothing is wasted!

Giant magnets remove many metals for repurposing. Blowers help remove paper products. Sifters help send glass to its proper place. Some form of material magic including rotating discs assures that plastics are repurposed and that cardboard is baled and ready to sell overseas. Even people are involved, making sure that what's left after mechanical reassignment is eyeballed by workers who are skilled at removing items capable of being repurposed. Be assured that what you put in your toters is not just entering a landfill. What's more, green waste pickups create 55,000 tons of compost annually, which is available for purchase.

You need to be aware, however, that NOT ALL trash can be disposed of in your toters. HHW — household hazardous waste — is not allowed. See the lists below for what is classified as HHW. Although you cannot put such material into your trash, Recology makes it convenient for you to dispose of hazardous waste. **The facility in Lincoln at 3195 Athens Avenue is open seven days a week from 8:00 to 5:00** and some items, also listed below, can be picked up at your address by making an appointment. 


